# SIN BINS

Temporary Dismissals - otherwise known as 'sin bins' - are mandatory for acts of dissent across all of grassroots football.

## HOW DO YOU FIND YOURSELF IN THE SIN BIN?



Players will only go into the sin bin for dissent cautions



For use of words, gestures, questioning or undermining the referee's decisions



### EXAMPLES OF DISSENT:

Shouting at the referee, questioning the referee's ability, slamming the ball into the ground and sarcastically clapping a decision

## DURATION OF A SIN BIN



For matches of 90 minutes, players spend 10 minutes in the sin bin



For matches of all other lengths, players spend 8 minutes in the sin bin



If the sin bin period has not expired at the end of:  
**1st half:** Continues into the 2nd half  
**2nd half:** Continues into extra time  
**Extra time:** Players can participate in the penalty shoot out

## THE MATCH DAY PROCESS



Dissent



Dissent caution: Referee issues a Yellow Card and directs the player to the touchline



Whilst in the sin bin, if the player commits a Yellow or Red Card offence they are sent off and can not be substituted



A player can only return to the field of play with the referee's permission at a stoppage in play



If a player receives a second Yellow Card for any type of offence, they will be shown a Red Card and dismissed from the field of play

Sin bins only apply to a player's first Yellow Card. If they receive a second Yellow Card they are dismissed from the field of play.

**Offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or actions is still a Red Card offence!**

# Langley FC - A Brief History

Langley Football Club was founded in 2010 by two local brothers from the Langley estate, Peter and Leon Phillips, who both had professional experience within the football industry. Recognising the need for a football club in their hometown, the Phillips brothers established Langley FC as a community-centred club, enabling talented local players to participate in competitive Saturday football. Their vision was to create a club that would not only compete on the field but also embody a strong sense of community and pride in the Langley area.

Since its formation, Langley FC has grown impressively, building on each year's successes to become one of the most respected football clubs in the region. Over the past 12 years, the club has achieved many accomplishments and was awarded the prestigious FA Chartered Standard. This accolade recognises the club's high-quality football provision, commitment to best practices, and development of players at all levels. Langley FC's commitment to professionalism and community spirit has set it apart as a role model for other amateur clubs, creating a nurturing environment for players of all ages and abilities.

The club's ascent has been nothing short of remarkable. Langley FC holds a record in local football for its rapid progression from the lowest tier of amateur park football (East Berks Division 4) to playing Step 6 Football in the Combined Counties League via the Hellenic League, an achievement that few clubs can match. This leap is a testament to the club's ambition, drive, and determination to excel. Along the way, Langley FC has won every domestic honour at the local level, solidifying its reputation as a competitive force. This journey reflects the tireless efforts of players, coaches, and volunteers who have worked to make Langley FC a success both on and off the field.

Currently, Langley FC's First Team is managed by Michael Woodham, who brings a wealth of experience and leadership to the role. Supporting him is Bradlee Greenwood, who oversees the Reserves and helps foster the next generation of talent. Langley FC has a vibrant youth program managed by Adam Rathmill and Lee Payne, with Demaro Woodruffe managing the Under-18s. This structured pathway for young players reflects the club's deep commitment to youth development, ensuring that young talent is nurtured and allowed to flourish. Season after season, the youth teams continue to grow and succeed, contributing to the club's exciting prospects.

In recent years, the club has grown to a point where it now requires its own dedicated facilities to meet its expanding needs. Langley FC has secured planning permission for a new home in Langley, a project that will further strengthen its community ties and provide a lasting legacy. In the meantime, Langley FC has announced a ground-share arrangement with Slough Town FC's Arbour Park, having previously spent two seasons at Uxbridge FC's Honeycroft. The club eagerly anticipates the move to its own grounds, which will serve as a central hub for both its teams and supporters, cementing its place as a pillar of the local community.

# Sandhurst Town – A Brief History

Sandhurst Football Club was founded in 1910 and originally played in the Reading & District League until 1979, apart from a brief period in the East Berkshire Football League. In 1979, the club joined the Aldershot & District Football League, and five years later, in 1984, finished as runners-up before becoming founder members of the Chiltonian Football League. This move marked the club's first step towards achieving senior status, and their best Chiltonian season came in 1986–87 when they finished second.

In 1990, the club was granted senior status by the Berks & Bucks County FA upon joining the Combined Counties Football League. The early years were difficult, finishing bottom in both of the first two seasons and avoiding relegation only due to another club's resignation. The team's fortunes turned around under the management of Peter Browning and later John Underwood, leading to several seasons of league and cup success.

The club's first home ground was a field next to the Bull & Butcher pub, before relocating to Memorial Park where they played for many decades, with a short period in the 1950s spent on a nearby pitch in St. John's Road. The introduction of the National Lottery in the 1990s provided the opportunity to develop a new home. With the support of Bracknell Forest Borough Council and Sandhurst Town Council, funding was secured to build the new ground at Bottom Meadow, which opened in August 1997 at a cost of £265,000.

The 2010/11 season marked the club's Centenary, celebrated in style by winning the Combined Counties League Cup Final and reaching two other semi-finals. By 2020, the club had embarked on a major redevelopment to secure its future for another century, investing heavily in facility upgrades at Bottom Meadow and strengthening its community presence. After work concluded, the club returned to a much-improved ground for the 2021/22 season.

In 2022, Sandhurst celebrated 110 years of football in the community. Despite challenges from the Covid-19 pandemic and the cancellation of anniversary events, the club's momentum continued with a full relaunch focused on education, community, and facility development. The completion of a pioneering state-of-the-art 3G pitch in summer 2023 made Bottom Meadow one of the most advanced football grounds in the country.

That same year, under manager Jordan Ive, the Fizzers won the Combined Counties Division One title and earned promotion to Step 5 in the Combined Counties Premier South. Ive departed in December 2023 for a Step 3 side, and Adam Barnard took charge for the 2024/25 season, assisted by Carl Barrie and Lee Barefoot. Although club ambitions remained high, ownership and operational issues at Bottom Meadow led to relegation back to Division One.

For the 2025/26 campaign, the SB Group regained operational control of Bottom Meadow, and Bob Ryan was appointed as first-team manager. With a rebuilt squad and renewed optimism, the aim is clear—to return Sandhurst Town to the Premier Division and continue building on its proud 115-year football legacy.
